An excerpt from the Authors Preface: Historically considered, the word paragraph means (a) a marginal character or note employed to direct attention to some part of the text; (b) a character similar to (a), but placed in the text itself; (c) the division of discourse introduced by a paragraph mark or by indentation, and extending to the next paragraph mark or the next indentation; (d) the rhetorical paragraph, that is, (c) developed to a structural unit capable of organic internal arrangement. The plan of the present essay is to discuss, in the first chapter, (a) and (b and other mechanical signs of the paragraph; in the second chapter to introduce (c) for the purpose of further definition; in the next seven chapters to show the historical development of (c) in English prose, first by a statement of the general development, then by a particularized account according to periods, then by a summary of this account; lastly, in an appendix, to offer a few incomplete notes on the development of (c) in Middle English verse.
